9 that hospital testing environment, can you not?

10 A. Yes, sir.

11 Q. And that's done on a regular and daily basis,  
12 especially when you want it quickly; isn't that true?

13 A. Yes, sir.

14 Q. And that request can be made by police officers,  
15 prosecutors, supervisors, people like that in law  
16 enforcement say, we want this stat, we want this pretty  
17 quick; isn't that true?

18 A. Not from a police officer. It has to come from  
19 the doctor. The doctor is the one that makes the orders.

20 Q. If someone makes a request from the doctor, then  
21 the doctor can say, yes, we want that pretty quick, that  
22 can happen?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Now, Ms. -- Nurse Langley, you're not,  
25 obviously, related to any type of police association or

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1 organization, correct?

2 A. Correct.

3 Q. And you're here to tell the truth to us,  
4 correct?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. And certainly, with Roy you recall as being  
7 nervous and emotional, if you felt that he, in fact, was  
8 intoxicated, that's something you'd remember; isn't that  
9 true?

10 A. I believe I would.
