Dear Ms. Adams-Jenkins:

The United States Attorney's Office has forwarded your letter, dated August 17, 2007, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for review. The actions of Officer Deana Ramsour, Euless Police Department, during the arrest of Roy Adams, Jr. are brought into question by your letter.

The FBI has no authority to conduct an investigation in the absence of an indication that a law within our investigative jurisdiction has been violated. Based on the information provided to the FBI, it cannot be determined if such a violation exists. Therefore, the FBI cannot be of assistance to your son.

The United States Department of Justice, has established specific criteria which, in most circumstances, must be present before the FBI will initiate an investigation. In order for a complaint to be considered by FBI Headquarters or an FBI field office, it should (1) be written by the victim or someone with first-hand knowledge of the alleged incident; (2) name the alleged victim(s) and subject(s), if known; (3) provide date(s) of the incident(s); (4) describe the incident(s); (5) describe the kinds of injuries sustained and whether or not medical treatment was sought; (6) describe any monetary or other loss resulting from the incident(s); and (7) contain the names of witnesses.

Covering events in a chronological order will aid an investigator in understanding the complaint. It is helpful to identify victims, subjects and witnesses by name, race, sex, and date of birth, if possible. If all these identifiers are not available, further identifiers could include telephone numbers, license plates, physical description, address and/or occupation.
